FIRST LOOK Nine die off the north coast



Nine Moroccan immigrants died just metres from the shore of Caleta de Caballo in northern Lanzarote on 5th November.

The *patera* (fishing boat) which carried the victims foundered off the coast at 1 am in the morning, with the victims assumed to have drowned as they attempted to reach dry land. Four survivors were detained and attended to by emergency services. The tragedy has raised pressing questions about the SIVE (Integrated System of External Vigilance) which has detected hardly any of the pateras that have arrived over the course of the past year. The boat in question departed from the Moroccan coast near Agadir five days before reaching Lanzarote, and all passengers were young Moroccan men.

The incident is just the latest tragedy to take place off Lanzarote's coastline. Last year, the bodies of five immigrants were retrieved from the sea near the popular tourist beach of Playa Bastián in Costa Teguise; and in 2009, a patera foundered in rough seas just a few metres off the coast of Los Cocoteros on Lanzarote's east coast. 25 immigrants, including 17 youngsters and two women, died in the most tragic nautical accident in the island's recent history.

Most of the dead from this tragedy were later buried in Guelmim, a Moroccan city lying 200 miles east of Lanzarote, and the incident led to the formation of an association of mothers who have attempted to inform young people about the risks and dangers of seeking a future on the high seas. However, they face a difficult task when faced with the promises of the traffickers.

One of the reasons why young men are risking their lives to come to the Canaries is the utter lack of opportunities in their home country. Mohammed Mubarak Mti of Guelmim, who has lost two sons to the seas, told ABC, "My sons refused to complete their studies and lost hope of making a living in this town. Their only dream was to emigrate to Europe, and the bitter reality of what they had to expect when they finished school meant we couldn't convince them."

Another reason for the recent influx may be the Moroccan government's decision to reintroduce military service earlier this year. The announcement was deeply unpopular with Moroccan youth, who may be forced into years of service.

King Drops In

King Felipe VI made a flying visit to Lanzarote on 31st October to officially open a spectacular exhibition at the César Manrique Foundation to celebrate the artist's centenary.



King Felipe saw photos of Manrique meeting his parents and his grandfather among the exhibits at the Foundation. The exhibition, titled "César Manrique – It's A Pleasure" will remain open until April.

Wind and Waves

Strong winds cut off the island of La Graciosa from Lanzarote for a day last month.

Winds and high seas rendered the ferry crossing from Órzola to Caleta de Sebo impossible on Monday 11th November, although normal (but very choppy) service was resumed on the next day.

The winds caused other problems on the island. Yaiza's secondary school was closed after part of its structure was damaged, and the collapse of a radio mast in Femés meant that a number of stations were off-air for a while.

Drone Discovery

A group of amateur archaeologists using a drone discovered a cave filled with the bones of ancient Canarian natives in Gran Canaria.

The cave is located in the craggy highlands of the island, in an area that is very difficult to access. The group detected the cave using a drone, before reaching it and reporting it to authorities.

The cave contains the bones of dozens of humans, and has been disturbed by unknown persons previously. The archaeologists hope that authorities will analyse the remains before returning them and sealing the cave.



Travel Fair

Lanzarote's President, María Dolores Corujo, and its Tourist Promotion councillor, Ángel Vásquez, flew to London last month to attend the World Travel Market 2019. The trade fair is one of the most important in the world, and a vital date for Lanzarote considering that the UK remains its most important market. Vásquez announced that delegates would be meeting "nine of the ten most important tour operators in Britain", and that the main aim of the fair for Lanzarote would be to "soften the impact caused by the collapse of Thomas Cook."

Green Light for Radiotherapy Unit

The Canarian Government has approved funds of almost 2.5 million euros to be spent on the first phase of the Radiotherapeutic Oncology Unit at Lanzarote's Doctor José Molina Orosa Hospital. Works are expected to commence in the first quarter of 2020, and it is hoped that the unit will open in 2021.

The project will require the construction of a radiotherapy bunker in the hospital, which must be made of sufficiently thick concrete to avoid the escape of radiation. This will require the demolition and possible relocation of a number of existing rooms in the hospital, including the current functions room.

Lanzarote's principal cancer charity, AFOL, has held well-attended demonstrations in favour of the radiotherapy unit in previous years. The possibility of receiving treatment on the island will mean that patients will avoid having to leave home to stay in Las Palmas de Gran Canaria at a time when they may be extremely weak and vulnerable.

Patera Captain Jailed

The captain of boat that arrived at La Santa in October last year with 27 illegal immigrants on board has been jailed for two and a half years by the Provincial Court.

The male, who is also subject to a deportation order, was found guilty of, "receiving various amounts of money from people who were transported to the Canarian coast in the knowledge that the rules of entry to Spanish territory were being broken, and that the passengers would be in an irregular status in Spain."

However, while each boat requires a skipper, it is well-known that these are relatively low level members of the trafficking mafias operating out of Morocco.

Mark Aid!


Mark Fenton is a locally-based musician who suffered a terrible accident after a bus drove over his foot, which meant that several toes and part of his foot had to be removed.

Immigrants increase

Police discovered 41 immigrants of Afghan origin in a refrigerated lorry leaving northern Greece in early November. The discovery highlights the people smuggling trade that ended in tragedy when 39 Vietnamese immigrants were found dead in a lorry in Grays, Essex, on 23rd October.

Meanwhile, in Spain, a video of a Moroccan immigrant throwing his medals into the sea before his boat arrived on Lanzarote went viral. Anuar Bujarsa was filmed throwing national medals he'd won in tackwondo tournaments over the edge of his boat, saying, "They're not worth anything. You can't eat medals."

Greta gets help

The Canarian Government offered their assistance to Greta Thunberg when the climate campaigner advertised for a lift across the Atlantic.

Riots in Santiago, Chile, led to the rescheduling of the UN climate summit in Madrid, but this left Thunberg, who refuses to take flights, stranded on the wrong side of the Atlantic. After tweeting for assistance, the Canarian Government responded, "Dear Greta. Canary Islands are a bridge between America and Europe in the middle of the Atlantic Ocean. We are fighting against the climate change. If you wish, the @parcan (Canarian Parliament) would be honored to help you. We need to join forces."

Nevertheless, as the trade winds from the Canaries are westward, Greta is likely to take a route further north.





Italy plastic tax

Italy's plastic tax could be withdrawn after pressure from producers has divided the country's fragile ruling coalition.

The proposed tax would have seen producers liable to pay a Euro for every kilogram of plastic containers and wrapping produced. However, the proposal was strongly opposed by Italy's business federation, who claimed that it would affect employment in a sector that hires 150,000 workers. Consumer associations claimed the tax would add 10% to product prices.

The ruling coalition, composed of the Five Star Movement and the Democratic Party, are divided on the issue.

30 years of history

November and December have seen several events to commemorate the astonishing events of 30 years ago, when the USSR and the Soviet bloc fell apart

November has already seen the anniversary of the massive demonstrations and the peaceful dismantling of the Berlin Wall in Germany. This was followed by the end of Communist rule in Bulgaria, the Velvet Revolution in Czechoslovakia, the resignation of East German chancellor Egon Krenz, the Singing Revolution in Lithuania, the execution of Romanian tyrant Nicolae Ceausescu and finally, Poland's abandonment of communism on 31st December.

The following year, 1990, saw the first democratic elections in every Eastern bloc country apart from Poland, who led the move to democracy in June 1989.

Britain's exit from the European union has been kicked another three months down the road after Boris Johnson called a general election to "get Brexit done".



After saying that he'd rather "die in a ditch" than postpone Brexit, Boris Johnson apologised to members of his party and expressed his "deep regret" that another "painful" extension had been sought.

The new extension date of 31st January, 2020 offers Johnson the chance to fight a general election which he hopes will give him a large enough parliamentary majority to pass his revised withdrawal agreement. The election will take place on 12th December - the first pre-Christmas election for 96 years.

Johnson's deal is basically the same one Theresa May thrashed out with the EU and presented three times top parliament, with changes to the Irish border agreements that will effectively see a border in the Irish Sea. That proved unacceptable to the government's coalition partners in the DUP, and as parliament had already outlawed a no-deal exit, Johnson had no choice but to propose an election.

Brexit election

Brexit will be a key issue in the election, and the main parties have already set their stalls out. The Conservatives are offering Johnson's agreement; Labour will attempt to forge a new agreement which

will then be subjected to a confirmatory referendum; the Liberal Democrats are pledging to revoke Article

50 without a referendum, and Nigel Farage's Brexit party are backing no deal in preference to Johnson's deal.

Jeremv

At the start of campaigning, the Conservatives were comfortably ahead in the polls, but the last election in 2017 shows how quickly things can change. This time, the Brexit Party and then Liberal Democrats hope to pick off disaffected voters from the two main parties, while the SNP is likely to wield greater power than ever. Another hung parliament is a distinct possibility, and would simply extend Johnson's discomfort.

Expats still barred

Despite the fact that the last two Conservative manifestos have pledged to grant votes for life to British citizens living overseas, the 15-year rule introduced under Labour's Tony Blair will still apply. That means that anyone who has lived abroad for more than 15 years will be ineligible to vote. Yet again, many thousands of expat Britons will be unable to participate in an election which is likely to have immediate effects on their livelihoods and futures.

Hollow victory

Pedro Sánchez's risky gamble permitted Spain's far right party, Vox, to double its representation to 52 seats in parliament.

Vox leader Santiago Abascal (above), who once "invaded Gibraltar" as a publicity stunt, capitalised on the violent demonstrations in Catalonia and a rise in immigration to promote his populist message, and voters in Murcia and outlying suburbs of the major cities responded.

Biggest Loser

Albert Rivera of Ciudadanos (below) was the night's big loser, and resigned immediately. Podemos splinter party, Más País, led by Iñigo Errejón also failed to fulfil expectations.



Spain's second general election in a year gave an even more fragmented result than the last one, and it appears as though the country may head into Christmas and the New Year without a government.

Pedro Sánchez's Socialist Party won the most seats once again, but his decision to throw the dice on another election has simply not paid off, and he will be faced with even greater difficulties in forming a government than he faced in the early summer.

The election campaign coincided with riots in Catalonia following the jailing of 12 Catalan activists and politicians found guilty of sedition,; as well as a spike in immigration – factors which played right into the hands of the populist Vox party, who doubled their representation in parliament to 52 seats. Meanwhile, the Ciudadanos party, who moved right in an attempt to capitalise on nationalist sentiment, lost out disastrously, ending up with just 10 of the 57 seats it won in April. Their leader, Albert Rivera resigned his post and his seat within 24 hours.

The far left-wing vote for Unidas Podemos was also split, with Pablo Iglesias's party shedding votes to the Más País party formed by his excolleague Iñigo Errejón.

Immediately after the results of the election were released, Sánchez and Iglesias reached an agreement to enter into a coalition, although this will require the support of several smaller parties to reach a majority.

The speed of this agreement contrasts with the months of disagreement, suspicion and anger that

failed to produce a government after the April election. It was this that caused Sánchez to call a second election, but the threat of the far right appears to have focused the leaders of both main left-wing parties.

A solution to the Catalan problem will be a priority for any new government - and the Socialists and Podemos do not see eye to eye on this.

Sánchez's victory came with a high price tag.

On Lanzarote, both the Socialists and the Popular party increased their vote, with Unidas Podemos taking third place, closely followed by Nueva Canarias/CC. Vox doubled their vote to become the fifth most important party, but won no seats.

In the Canaries as a whole, five Socialist deputies will go to Madrid, along with four PP representatives and two each from the NC/CC, Unidas Podemos and Vox, who appear to have snapped up the two seats that Ciudadanos held for a brief eight months.

Horse Play



The decision to remove four mounted horse sculptures from the shore in front of Arrecife's Castillo de San José has caused controversy, and launched campaigns to leave them where they are. The four sculptures form a work called The Rising Tide, by British artist Jason deCaires Taylor, and are intended as a statement on climate change. Like deCaires Taylor's other major work on the island, the Atlantic Museum at Playa Blanca, the work consists of concrete sculptures in a marine environment.

However, the Cabildo recently invited applicants for a contract to "dismantle and remove" the four sculptures, with a quote of over $\pounds 24,000$ given for the job. It is intended that the sculptures will be kept in a warehouse belonging to the Cabildo, away from public view. DeCaires Taylor says that he was told that the reason for their removal was that they "damage the image of the works of César Manrique".

The sculptures were installed on a "temporary" basis in September 2016, and are a copy of an earlier work that deCaires Taylor had exhibited in London. However, there has been long-standing criticism of the ex-Cabildo President's support for the British artist. Critics have claimed that deCaires Taylor is not established on the international exhibition/auction art market, and there are also concerns about the money spent on the Atlantic Museum project.

What is quite clear is that this is a


row that is every bit as political as it is aesthetic. This was made clear when Cabildo President Dolores Corujo said, "this artist was lucky to fall into favour with the then-President of the Cabildo (Pedro San Ginés of the CC) with his phobias and philias."

The long-standing web of alliances and oppositions between the Coalición Canaria, the Socialist party, the César Manrique Foundation and

influential players on the island has changed along with the government of the institutions after this year's elections, and it seem that scores are being settled.


Meanwhile, Arrecife Ayuntamiento has held a meeting about the possibilities of relocating the sculptures elsewhere in the capital.

Franco Reburied



44 years after his death, the corpse of General Francisco Franco was dug up and transferred to a grave in Madrid last month, after a long campaign to relocate his body.

Franco's coffin was exhumed from its resting place in the basilica of the Valle de los Caídos (Valley of the Fallen), the immense religious monument that he ordered to be built as an act of "national reconciliation" after the end of the Spanish Civil War.

The monument contains the remains of 40,000 Civil War dead, from both the Republican and Nationalist side. However, none of the families of the dead gave their permission for this choice, and the presence of Franco – one of the generals whose military uprising started the Civil War – has long been controversial.

Although he wished to be buried in Madrid, Franco was buried at the monument following his death in 1975. He was the only one of the dead in the monument not to have died in the Civil War.


His presence at a monument that was supposed to be a non-political space has long angered campaigners. They claim that the monument was a "concentration camp", built by prisoners, many of whom were Republicans, and objected to the fact that it had become the focus for annual celebrations of Franco's death by surviving fascist supporters and younger followers of the far right.

Franco has now been laid next to the body of his wife, Carmen Polo, at the Mingorrubio cemetery in Madrid. His coffin was exhumed under conditions of strict privacy at the monument, and borne out of the basilica by family members, before being



placed in a helicopter.

However, many criticised the decision to allow press and public to attend the exhumation after 200 Franco supporters attended the new cemetery to pay tribute to him. Among them was Col. Antonio Tejero, the Guardia Civil officer who led the failed 1981 coup in Spain's parliament.

Face to Face with: Oswaldo Betancort, Mayor of Teguise



Oswaldo Betancort has served as the Mayor of Teguise, Lanzarote's largest municipality, for eight years and commenced his third term at the head of the Ayuntamiento earlier this year, when he also won a seat as a representative in the Canarian parliament. **Photos: Sabring Suppers**

Billed from the start as a rising star in the Coalición Canaria, Betancort won his second absolute majority in a row in May. Shaun Addison spoke to him in the sumptuous colonial surroundings of the Palacio Spinola.

This is the third time you've been elected Mayor. Aren't you getting tired of it yet?

Actually, I'm more excited than I've ever been. Things have changed a lot in eight years. When I came to power in 2011, the challenge was economic – we had to reduce debts. Now our main challenge is spending, and the need to build the infrastructure necessary for a modern tourist municipality.

You're also serving as a deputy for Lanzarote in the Canarian Parliament. Is there a danger that you may be spreading yourself too thin?

I don't think so. I'm only in Tenerife for two days out

of every ten, and while I'm there I'm doing what I can to represent Teguise and bring benefits back to Teguise. For example, I'm demanding greater health services for the smaller islands such as Lanzarote. Currently, a heart attack victim needs to be flown to Gran Canaria for surgery, and we'd like facilities for that to take place here instead. Meanwhile, I've got a team here who are more than capable of looking after things.

Before May's elections your party, the CC, controlled the Canaries, Lanzarote's Cabildo and held far more influence and power than now. How are you finding things now that different parties are in charge?

It's difficult, because they've refused lots of funding. We were counting on projects for the upkeep of Playa de Cucharas, a school, the sanitation infrastructure and a historical archive, but it's all been withdrawn.

Is there an element of score-settling in this?

Of course. That's what happens in party politics.

What projects will be completed in the near future?

In Costa Teguise, we'll be finishing a football pitch at Calle Chafari as well as a civic centre near the Arenas School. There's another civic centre being built at Las Caletas, and we're going to renovate the Pirate Museum at the Castillo de Santa Barbara. That's all going to happen in 2020, but we'll also be spending a lot of money on resurfacing roads in Costa Teguise and modernising hotel facilities.

The collapse of Thomas Cook and the withdrawal of Ryanair's bases has been a blow for tourism this year. How will Teguise address these issues?

I think 2019 will be seen as a "before and after" date for Lanzarote. The sun and beach model of tourism will no longer be as important, and we'll be more interested in developing the island's appeal as a sporting and cultural destination. The Villa de Teguise was chosen as one of the 20 prettiest towns in Spain earlier this year, and there's a lot more that we've got to offer.



Such as?

I'd highlight five events: the windsurfing championship at Costa Teguise; the Noche Blanca (White Night) in Teguise; the Famara Total trail run, a spectacular event which is really becoming popular; the Saborea Lanzarote Food Fair at the end of November and, of course, the Lanzarote International Marathon. But there's much more...

You spoke out recently following the deaths of nine migrants off the northern shore of the island.

Teguise is the municipality where 90% of the boats have arrived, and all of the three major tragedies on our island, Los Cocoteros, Playa Bastián and Caleta de Caballo took place here.

It's important to raise our voice about this.

What can be done?

First, we need a radar system that works, and can detect the boats in time to avoid tragedies. We'll also need to improve relations with Morocco and work on dismantling the mafias that charge €2,000 for each person, with promises of a utopia at the other end.

Any news on the abandoned hotels in Costa Teguise?

It's taken time, but we've freed up the planning regulations that means they can be developed. It's already happening in a couple of places.

Another issue that has arisen recently is the arrival of electric scooters. What's the council's stance on these?

We've got no problem with the idea, but any

company that operates in Teguise will have to pay for a licence, pay its taxes and comply with basic safety regulations. In this case, the company just dumped them on the streets. We've introduced a bye-law that means we can fine the company and withdraw the scooters if the fines aren't paid and the scooters aren't insured, and we can also fine dangerous drivers.

Spain's election has failed to produce a firm result. Does the lack of a national government affect your work?

Of course it does. The government is responsible for the regional budgets, and without those, local institutions don't know where we stand. We can't make spending plans, and that means stagnation. Without clear budgets, the Canarian Government is forced to raise taxes, and that means less money to spend.

Do you have a Christmas message for our readers, Señor Alcalde?

I'd just say that I hope that the New Year brings work, which means good health; and union, which brings strength.

Shocking Experience

Last Saturday, my wife (71) and I (79) were walking from the H10 Rubicón Palace towards the Timanfaya. Near the Natura Palace a man with a clipboard got up from a seat and approached us. Knowing the signs, my wife simply said "No thanks" and we walked on. Later he overtook us and went on to talk to another couple 20 or 30 yards away. We got up and continued towards town. When he had finished his conversation he turned and walked towards us. As he passed us, he spat in my wife's face and walked off.

Obviously, my wife was extremely upset and shocked. We immediately returned to the hotel and my wife posted details on the Playa Blanca Facebook site. She received dozens of expressions of sympathy and also other examples of outrageous behaviour by these scammers.

We have been coming to Playa Blanca once or twice a year for 10 years now and have always felt safe. This may well be our last time. The general impression given by locals who responded was that the police weren't interested in this sort of thing. Some suggested contacting the council, which I wouldn't know how to do.

Your publication gives a very positive view of life in Lanzarote. Unfortunately, we have just experienced another side to it.

100 Years of Juan

Since April 2019, Lanzarote has been celebrating the centenary of its most famous son, César Manrique. But Manrique wasn't the only island legend to have been born in the year 1919.

Juan Brito came into the world seven months after Manrique, but while the famous artist was born to a wealthy family in Arrecife, he belonged to a poor peasant household in a remote rural zone of Tinajo. Young Juan never went to school, and was a silent, tongue-tied child who grew up herding camels and other livestock in the fields, where he came to know the island's wildlife deeply.

When the Spanish Civil War came in 1936, the illiterate youth was called up to fight in the Nationalist army, and it was there that he not

only learnt to read and write, but also began to talk after he was almost killed in a shelling.

Juan returned to Lanzarote, where he tried to set up as a camel farmer before "getting into an argument" with a camel, "I lost" he said ruefully. For years he worked as a taxi driver, at one point driving film star Raquel Welch down to Papagayo.

While waiting for tourists he'd taken to the beach or volcanoes, Juan would explore the island,

making several important archeological discoveries. He also learnt pottery at the side of the island's last traditional potter, Dorotea de Armas, and formed a folklore group called Los Campesinos. Poems and songs poured from his pen, and he immersed himself in the island's folklore, gaining immense knowledge that was only made more profound by his deep roots in the island.

"Born in 1919 Juan Brito became a living library of Lanzarote lore."



Don Juan died shortly after his beloved wife Isabel less than two years ago, at the age of 98, and his life has since been the subject of a prize-winning documentary. To mark the centenary of his birth, the Juan Brito Foundation will be holding various events in every municipality on the island. Activities will include folk music, pottery workshops and archeology talks.



It Really Could Be You...



El Gordo means "the fat one", and is actually the name Spaniards use for the big prize in any lottery. But while other lotteries such as the UK National Lottery and Euromillions may offer bigger prizes, they can't come close to the spectacle, the sense of community and the sheer festive spirit of the Sorteo Extraordinarío de Navidad – the fattest El Gordo of all.

Every participant will have a ticket, or a share in one, that has five numbers. There are 170 series of tickets, and if, for example, the winner of the grand $\notin 4$ million prize is the number 12345, then all 170 tickets bearing that number will win that amount.

This year, for example, there are 170 series of 100,000 tickets each, giving a total of 17,000,000 tickets that cost \notin 200 each. That's \notin 3.4 billion of tickets, which give \notin 2.38 billion (70% of ticket sales) out as prizes.

But there are also several prizes: a \notin 1,250,000 second prize, a \notin 500,000 third prize and thousands of \notin 1,000

prizes that shower welcome little bonuses of hundreds of Euros far and wide throughout Spain.

Tickets are distributed by number, and it's often possible to buy the same number in several series in one locality. This means that when El Gordo lands, it brings wealth and joy to one particular town or barrio joy that's repeated on a smaller scale everywhere a prize falls.

More recently, the annual El Gordo TV advert has become another major

event. A cinema-style production lasting over five minutes, it's usually a tear-jerking, heart-warming tale, and one that always provides insights into Spanish life and culture.

Next to Spain's annual explosion of joy, sharing and charity, it's hard to avoid the feeling that there's something a bit miserable and materialistic about other lotteries, with their solitary multi-million prize winners.

How to take part in El Gordo

Buy a Ticket

Like any lottery, you need to be in it to win it, but that's a bit more of an investment when it comes to El Gordo, as every ticket costs \notin 200. As a result, most people will buy a décimo (tenth share) for \notin 20, entitling them to one tenth of the winnings. Décimos are popular gifts around the Christmas period, and are often bought and sold on by bars or in community



associations, but you can also get them at official lottery shops and from ONCE sellers.

Watch the Draw

The draw takes place on the morning of the 22nd of December, and takes several hours. Throughout the morning, a parade of freshlyscrubbed boys and girls from the San Ildefonso school for orphans will pluck wooden balls from a huge, whirling spherical cage, then announce the numbers in a sing-song voice. Sometimes they burst into tears with the emotion of the spectacle. It's absolutely weird, strangely hypnotic and utterly unique.

Collect your winnings

If El Gordo falls in your neighbourhood, then expect TV cameras to turn up soon. The streets will fill with people popping the corks on bottles of cava.

The winnings are tax free, and for several years certain Spanish politicians would seem to win with surprising frequency. In fact, this was usually a crude but effective way of money laundering, and for a while those in the know might contact their local corrupt official to see if they could get an even better price for their winning ticket.

Then all that's left for you to do is *tirar la* casa por la ventana – throw the house out of the window. The phrase is associated with the earliest days of the lottery, when winners would throw all their old clothes and furniture into the street to be replaced, but nowadays it just means "celebrate wildly".



Sodeto's Story

Sodeto, a tiny village of 250 souls in Huesca, Northern Spain, shows how El Gordo can bring wealth to an entire community. In 2012, the big prize landed in the village, whose housing association had taken charge of several tickets with the winning numbers.


As a result, every adult in the village except one shared a €14 million jackpot. The story of a declining rural village that suddenly struck the big time went international, with features in the New York Times. However, a report a few years ago showed that the win hadn't really changed the village. "Most people bought tractors" said one villager.

"Mr Unlucky"

Sodeto's €14 million win was shared by every adult in the



village except one – Costis Mitsotakis, a Greek film maker who had arrived recently and didn't even know what was going on. However, "the unluckiest man in Spain" won something that was just as important to him – a story. Mitsotakis picked up his camera and made a popular documentary film about his new home.

Angelina's Here Angelina Jolie came to the Volcan del Cuervo on Lanzarote last month to film scenes from the new Marvel film, The Eternals.



The Eternals is a new departure for Marvel studios, introducing several new characters based on an epic comic book series spanning tens of thousands of years. Jolie is expected to play the role Thena, and has already been spotted on Fuerteventura filming with British co-stars Kit Harington and Gemma Chan. Jolie was also seen on a windswept outing to the famous sand dunes of Corralejo with four of her six children, where they attended the annual kite festival.

Most of the Fuerteventura filming has taken place in the south of the island, where a special set has been built in a location that is usually reserved for army manoeuvres. The area had to be briefly evacuated when an unexploded missile was found.

Angelina Jolie is just the latest in a series of big names to visit the Canaries in recent years. George Clooney visited Tenerife to scout locations for a new film earlier this year, while Jolie's ex-partner, Brad Pitt, came to Fuerteventura three years ago to film scenes for the war film Allied, in which he starred alongside Oscar-winning French actress Marion Cotillard.

Dramatic Scene

The Volcán del Cuervo was the first volcano to be thrown up by the eruptions of the 18th century, and remains one of the most dramatic sights on the island - all the more so because it is outside Timanfaya National park and thus accessible by the public. Recent renovations, which have provided a footpath, information boards and a car park, have helped to popularise the volcano.

With its stark surroundings, its "shark's fin" and its impressive crater, the Volcán del Cuervo has already proved popular with the makers of the BBC's Dr Who series.

Lanzarote vet Jane Burke reminds us that dogs and cats don't need treats and daft presents - all they really want for Christmas is you.

Have you sorted out your pets list for Santa yet?

I tried to get my dogs to discuss this article with me but they really only showed enthusiasm for 'walkies' and 'food'.

As a veterinary surgeon and an animal lover my first and most positive advice for all pet owners is that the best Christmas presents money can buy can never compare to the gift of more of your time. Time given regularly, dependably and willingly, and spent sharing physical activities is the ultimate gift of love and kindness, whether it is for a child, an elderly neighbour, a sedentary old cat or frenetic puppy. The gift of your time, your attention and your enthusiasm to learn something with them is truly twice-blessed.

So, I am thinking more frequent and/or longer walks; games that involve seek and/or fetch; time to attend courses to learn search and rescue, agility, basic obedience; or really any activity that involves exercising both physically and intellectual participation. Both the longevity and quality of life of your old cat or dog can be improved by introducing short stimulating periods of play to each day. Organize these to take place before feeding or going for a walk - this way their attention is further rewarded. If you can, get your children involved, or try to get any elderly relatives to, at least, supervise!

But most importantly you yourself need to put this time aside to ensure the activity is challenging but not punishing! Make sure it always ends on a success, however small, (and if the kids are involved this means they get to be praised too!) Remember we all only make progress if we get consistently rewarded at the appropriate moment. Remember too that it takes three weeks to make an activity habitual (whether good or bad) so you need persevere at least through to the end of January!

So, I hope I have inspired you to work out and set up a pet stimulating course, (e.g. for the cat maybe feathers on the end of a fishing line that can persuade them to chase through tunnels and hoops, for the dog maybe a scent trail to find a buried sausage at the bottom of the garden), get your kids busy searching the internet for inspiration and do send me the videos of your progress!

Nevertheless, I suspect many of you will still be wanting to buy presents to wrap. Again, may I strongly suggest you look for interactive toys? Get your children to do research on the net to evaluate safety and durability. Do not take risks with small parts, sharp objects or upset stomachs, and please think very carefully about houseplants and

flowers in the home - a gift of scented lilies can be fatal to cats while a difendaccula plant can be a death threat to the pet dog.

Books, dvds, magazines or tokens for local classes here on island to attend obedience, agility or fly ball classes would all make brilliant presents for a pet or pet owner.

Finally, I can't resist asking you all NOT to buy food treats. Please! Do not buy any! Brightly coloured ones are often the worst, but almost all of them are dangerously loaded with preservatives, artificial flavouring and extremely high in salt. And be very careful they can't steal the kid's chocolates, the Christmas cake or the mince pies. Don't let your visitors feed them. Too much of anything can and will be lethal. At best, their illness will spoil your Christmas - at worst it will haunt every Christmas to come.

One last personal plea. Try and spend your Christmas present budget this year on gifts from our local charities, and urge your children to do the same. This way your money buys some kindness for pets that do not have a loving home or families



that cannot afford food, let alone Christmas luxuries. Please encourage your friends to make it a shared Christmas ritual that you strive to buy each other only presents from the charities and to spend at least a few hours of their holidays together helping out at a fundraiser or walking homeless creatures.

Just imagine the impact if everyone could be persuaded to try this and change our season of selfish greed into a competitive culture of kindness!



Remember too the special impact of loneliness that Christmas imposes on the lonely and bereaved. Ensure your pets bowls are brimming with clean water and drink a toast to giving just a little time to share with those who don't have a furry friend to sing carols to and love.

Christmas Ham with Mustard and Honey Crust

A cooked ham is the perfect centre-piece for a holiday meal, and one of those festive treats that somehow tastes even better cold than hot. Look for a piece of gammon and don't make the mistake of putting a cured Spanish jamón serrano in the oven!

Ingredients

1.5 to 2 kilo piece of ham or gammon
4 tbsp of honey
1 tbsp of soy sauce
1 tbsp of salt
1 tsp of brown sugar
2 tbsp of Dijon mustard
1 tbsp of old-fashioned mustard
Some white wine and water
1/2 tbsp of pepper
Aluminium foil

Method


Slash any fat or skin on the ham in a cross-hatch pattern. Rub the salt into the ham 30 minutes before cooking it.

Mix all the other ingredients apart from the water and wine until you get a paste. If it's too liquid, add more honey.

Preheat the oven to 200°. Rub the paste into the ham. Once it's ready, add a glass of wine and half a glass of water, cook the ham for 20 minutes, then cover it with aluminum foil.

Decrease the heat of your oven to 150°, and cook until you reach a total of one hour for every kilo of ham (e.g if your ham is 2 kilos, you'll need the first 20 mins plus 1 hour 40 minutes.)

You can serve it hot or cold.





A unique exhibition that focuses on the various features that made up the multifaceted character of César Manrique and built him into a social and media icon.

Central to the Centennial exhibition, it explores his life and development as a public figure through an intense media projection which is associated with Lanzarote and his house (now the César Manrique Foundation) in Tahiche, "where he developed an aesthetic of pleasure that transformed art into life and life into the art of living".

This is a large-format exhibition that consists of

more than 400 photographs, both of the public and private elements of the Manrique's life, and a total of 17 audiovisuals, occupying an area of 1,600 square metres.

Reproductions of his carnival masks are also exhibited, plus ceramics that he designed in the 50s, paintings etc. Different rooms of his house are to used to display objects including mannequins, books, clothing, African sculptures and personal diaries. It really is a fantastic insight into the life, likes and legacy of the man who was so essential in shaping Lanzarote into the island it is today.


Following the motto "Nature is connected to everything", Sandra creates work that is focused on the various influences the landscape has on almost every aspect of life on Lanzarote.

Spotlight On... GERIE B

Gerie B has been one of the island's favourite entertainers for almost 20 years. Julie Helliwell met with her to find out more about her singing career and how she keeps it so fresh and vibrant!

How long have you been a singer?

I've been singing all my life. I sang with my Dad's band, The AI Rath Dance Band, when I was 14. I did a few shows with them, but I didn't have much confidence at that age. My Dad was an amazing showman and I think he'd be proud of me now. I met my husband when I was young. We started a family and he already had kids, so raising seven children meant I had a late start to my entertainment career.

I became a professional singer by accident really, when I was 36. We had a pub, and one rainy night, a woman came in to sing karaoke. She was called Christine Brennan and I thought, "Wow". I sang too, and she thought, "Wow". After talking, we decided it was now or never and formed a duo called 'Feminine Touch'. We won an award in the Variety Club of Great Britain and work was coming in fast.

Christine and I came here on holiday over 20 years ago. We did a bit of singing and were invited back three times that year. The following year, we came for a month and did a gig at Las Calas. From that, we had a show every night. We then went into business with a guy and opened Bonkers, a cabaret showbar. After a year, Christine had an accident and had to go home so I became a solo artist. It's my 20th anniversary next year, so I should do something to celebrate it!

How have things changed over the years?

The money's halved! With the depression, people in England were struggling financially and the island suffered with fewer tourists. But I do think that the entertainment scene is booming now - especially in Costa Teguise. Within five minutes, you can find great entertainment and venues. Audiences still want to be entertained, rather than sung at, but I think it's harder to entertain younger audiences and you have to find other ways to engage them. I have a comedy element to my show where I'll use wigs or props when singing Cher, Dolly Parton or Tina Turner. People won't let me drop that side of it and continue to ask me to do it.

What's your favourite style of music to sing?

Coming from a cabaret background, I had a broad base, but over time, my voice has matured so I now sing other styles, like rock. It just depends what the audience want. I can instantly change my show, and I think flexibility is the name of the game, especially when you're playing at the same venues and to people who come back year after year. I've got a few people that have been coming to see me since the beginning.



Tell us more about the band that you're in.

We're called The Sound Collective, and it's a collective of eight wonderful musicians who each contribute their own area of expertise. For me, the Latin rhythms and tempos that we play fit well with the island and will appeal to all nationalities. We take songs and freshen them up, making them our own. I have recorded three solo albums and would like to do a country one in the future, plus an album with the band eventually.

How many songs can you sing?

If I sang my entire playlist, I could sing for at least 24 hours. As long as the audience are enjoying it, I enjoy singing any genre, and I really like introducing new songs. I also really love doing Latin music with the band that I'm in. That's what attracted me to the island in the first place; bars with small rooms and different styles of music in each.







BAMBOO TIME

Richard Rogers' Terminal 4 building at Madrid's Barajas airport is one of the major works in which bamboo has played an important role.

Bamboo is a vital building material in the Far East, and several modern homes are made entirely of the material. However, in Europe the material is forbidden as a basic construction material, although smaller structures and details are permitted.

The fact that bamboo doesn't grow in Europe is another

barrier to its adoption here, but several architects are also developing new ideas to make greater use of a material that is light, strong, flexible and sustainable. From Madrid airport to chiringuito beach bars, bamboo could soon be everywhere.

LOTS OF EGGS, LOTS OF BASKETS

Spain's Tourism Minister, Reyes Maroto, warned the Canary Islands not to rely too heavily on big tour operators during a visit in October.

Maroto's visit came in the aftermath of the collapse of Thomas Cook, and the minister has been working round the clock with tourist professionals from the Canaries and further afield.

Maroto announced that the Spanish government would extend a $\in 15$ million grant to help deal with the consequences of Thomas Cook's fall, and recommended that the island seek a diverse and varied range of tourism providers.

The minister's announcement could have a direct effect on holiday rental laws which, along with budget flights, have been key to the rise of independent tourism on the islands.



FIRST AID FIRST

Any holiday rental property in Spain must have a First Aid kit by law, but it makes sense to go a little further extra than the basic kit most of us will provide.

Your kit should contain: plasters in a variety of different sizes and shapes, various-sized gauze dressings, at least 2 sterile eye dressings, triangular bandages, crêpe rolled bandages, safety pins, disposable sterile gloves, tweezers, scissors, alcohol-free cleansing wipes, sticky tape, thermometer (preferably digital), skin rash cream, cream or spray to relieve insect bites and stings, antiseptic cream, painkillers such as paracetamol (and an infant paracetamol such as Apiretal for children), aspirin (not to be given to children under 16), or ibuprofen (Dalsy for kids), cough medicine, antihistamine cream or tablets, distilled water for cleaning wounds and an eye wash and eye bath.

A First Aid guide in English will also be useful,



and be sure to provide details of emergency numbers, the nearest health centre, directions to the hospital etc.



SAVINGS FAIR GAME

The Spanish Supreme Court has made a controversial ruling that will allow tax authorities to sequester tax debts from the accounts of those on the minimum wage, in cases where the money is not spent.

Previously, minimum wage earners were exempt from embargos (forcible sequestration of funds), but now the Supreme Court has ruled that any money unspent will be classed as savings and subject to sequestration. The decision is likely to prove highly contentious among consumer groups. However, it also reflects a reality in which the official wages of hundreds of thousands of employees do not reflect their real income.

Lawyer José María Salcedo said that the decision was a "dangerous" precedent that could lead to tax authorities emptying the accounts of workers.

FOREIGN INTEREST



If you want to get an idea of where foreign buyers prefer to set up home in Spain, a map produced by the Spanish Society of Registrars provides a good starting point.

16,209 homes in Spain were bought by foreign buyers in the second quarter of this year – a total of 12.46% of all Spanish sales. This means that foreign buyers are still a vital element of the country's real estate market, but only in certain areas.

The province of Alicante saw by far the largest amount of foreign buyers, with over 40% of sales going to non-Spanish buyers. Tenerife came next, with 28% of sales, while Las Palmas – the other Canarian province which contains Lanzarote, saw 23.48% of sales go to foreigners.

Figures show that British buyers are still very much focused on the traditional coastal areas and the islands. This is almost certainly a result of their already strong presence in these areas. Meanwhile, healthy property sales

to foreigners in inland provinces near to the larger cities are probably a result of younger working migrants Morocco from and Latin America managing to get onto the property ladder.

Nevertheless, there are still provinces in Spain where foreign buyers simply don't seem to matter. The stunning northeastern area of Galicia is one of them. Despite magnificent scenery, food and a strongly Celtic culture, fewer than 1% of buyers in all four provinces comes from outside Spain.

Rural inland areas with traditionally high levels of unemployment also see little foreign interest. 1,000 years ago, Córdoba was the biggest and most important city in Europe, but nowadays it, and other historical hotspots such as Badajoz and Salamanca, are languishing in a longterm trough, as younger locals move to bigger cities and the remaining population gets older.

Of course, the information in the map remains general. In Las Palmas,



for example, you'll find several "micro-markets". There are the traditional tourist flats and villas, but also significant amounts of urban accommodation and inland rural areas, and all of these categories display different behaviour.



PROPERTY BUYERS GUIDE

This article is a general guide to buying real estate in The Canary Islands. It has been compiled from the knowledge and experience of a number of professionals involved in the selling, buying and conveyancing of property in Spain, but it should not be taken as a substitute for proper legal advice.

LOCATION

Is your property intended for holiday use, longer term visits, or do you intend to live here all year round? Your choice of location should take your needs into account, such as schools, medical services and recreational outlets.

RESEARCH

You need to know a great deal more about your property than you would if you were just spending a couple of weeks there. If there is a community association, ask your neighbours if it is well run. Ask about the community fees - don't forget that if you are in a community you are legally obliged to pay these.

BUYING THE PROPERTY

First, make sure that the person selling you the property is entitled to do so. Your agent will be able to supply you with a list of suitable lawyers to act on your behalf, or the British Consulate in Las Palmas can provide a suitable list on request. Your lawyer needs to check out your intended property thoroughly.

A check of legal title will be made through a search in the local Land Registry Office, which will also indicate if there are any mortgages or charges against the property. If you are buying a plot of land, the lawyer will also check if you can obtain permission to build on the land, and what size and type of property you can build. Once you have been assured by your lawyer that all is in order, you will need to sign a Contract of Purchase raised by a lawyer, and pay a deposit which is usually 10% of the intended purchase price; this deposit is normally held by the lawyer who has been appointed to arrange the signing of the title deed.

The contract will state the terms and conditions of the sale and will state a specific time for completion. If you decide, up to this completion time, that you cannot proceed with the purchase, you will forfeit the deposit paid, but if the seller changes his mind, he must return the deposit to you in full, plus a compensation payment for damages.

The next step is to complete the transaction by making the outstanding balance of payment and signing the title deed, which is known in Spain as the Escritura. This must be done in the Notary's Office. The Notary's task is to ensure that all of the legal documentation is correct. He will also carry out a search in the Land Registry Office on the day of signing to check the current status of the property or land (and will require the last annual rates receipt from the council in which the property is situated), that this is up to date as well. It is essential to ensure that your lawyer has current receipts for all other payments such as water, electric and community charges, as debts such as these in Spain are levied against the property and not the owner. Notaries now also demand an Energy Performance Certificate. When in the Notary's Office, you will be asked to produce your passport as evidence of identification. You will also be advised to obtain a NIF number, which your lawyer can arrange for you.

MONEY MATTERS

If you are not resident in Spain and are buying property or land it is advisable to bring money from abroad to complete the purchase. It is simple to open a nonresident account in a local bank, and your estate agent will normally help you with this. You can then transfer your funds from your own bank in the UK to this new account. On the signing of the new title deed your cheques for payment will be shown to the Notary and included as part of the documentation of the deed.

They must be inscripted with details of the property of land to be purchased, or have an investment certificate from the issuing bank attached. The Notary will also require you to sign a Spanish ministry form, declaring that the investment has been made. It is also possible when purchasing from a non-Spanish resident to pay the completion funds abroad in any currency. In this case, the deed will state an equivalent amount in Euros, as this gives the value in which the transmission tax (stamp duty) is calculated. You will have to produce more than one cheque as you will be liable for capital gains tax. In this situation, a sum of 3% calculated against the value declared in the title deed will need to be retained and paid to the Spanish Tax Authorities.

Estate Agent's fees are normally paid by the vendor and the details of the specific percentage to be paid will normally be noted in the Purchase Contract.

Some unscrupulous illegal agents have been known to charge the purchaser as well as the vendor for their fees, so ensure this is not the case. You may well also find that the price of your title deed is not exactly the same as the cost of the purchase, as some sellers prefer to treat the furnishings and fittings, if they are included, as a separate item.

REGISTERING THE PURCHASE

To complete the transaction you must register the deeds at the Registro de la Propiedad (Property Registry). When the deeds are taken to the Registro, the purchase tax of 6.5% of the value of the property must be paid.

Later the Registro will request a second payment to

THE COMMUNITY OF OWNERS

The Community of Owners is a Spanish institution affecting any property owners who enjoy shared facilities and services, such as lifts, swimming pools, gardens and communal garages.

Information about your Association must be freely available to you, as should the accounts which have to be published to the members every year. You should check before you buy that your Community Association is functioning well, how much the monthly payment is, and whether the payments for your intended property are up to date.

cover their charges. In addition, a tax to the Local Authority, based on the increase of values of land in their area since the property last changed hands (known as 'Plus Valia') is payable.

This is often negotiated between the vendor and purchaser. Your Lawyer can get an estimate in advance of the purchase, so that you have the funds ready. At the same time, a form should be entered to the local authority, advising them of the change of ownership. You should remind whoever is doing your paperwork about this, as it is often forgotten.

Residents must also be tax registered in order to sell property and avoid retentions, even if they pay no tax.

OTHER COSTS

Other costs include the Transmission Tax, the Notary's bill, the fees from the Registro and your lawyer's fee, which will probably come to about 10% of the purchase price.

Your lawyer will ask for these funds to be placed with them before the work is done as clients have often disappeared leaving these bills unpaid.

Non-residents will be liable for property tax, while residents will pay the IBI assessed by the local council.

OUTSTANDING BILLS

When you buy a property you become liable for any outstanding bills for water, electricity, local rates and community fees. Both the Electricity Board (UNELCO) and the Water Company (CANAL GESTION) have forms which you and the seller must sign, to transfer the bills into your name. When you go to do this check that all payments are up to date.

Local rates are payable at the Town Hall. You or your representative will need to visit the 'Oficina de Recaudacion' at the Town Hall to complete the form changing the rates into your name, and again, checking that all payments are up to date. As bills are not sent out for the rates, property owners often forget to pay them, and they can soon mount up.

#ASKING PRICE



"It's almost standard practice," explained Francis Fernández Ariza, a director of marketing research association SIRA. Quoted in the Spanish press he said "Vendors take it for granted that they will get a counter offer and start off with an asking price that leaves them some wiggle room, in some cases this is as much as 20% higher." Only 10 per cent of properties sold in Spain go for the original asking price, according to new figures. It's a stark contrast with the USA, where more than 35 per cent of properties go for the price asked.

However, the practice is not good news for the property sector in Spain. In many cases, an inflated asking price will simply exclude the property from the viewing list of prospective buyers right from the start. Few buyers will waste time visiting properties that are significantly over the budget in the hope that they can bargain the price down.

Fernández argues that the problem is caused by lack of involvement by estate agents. "The best transparency is

acheived when sellers and buyers agree on the target price, as happens more frequently in the US", he said. And it's the estate agent, who knows the market well, who is best-placed to advise on that target price.

However, that's exactly the argument you'd expect from an estate agent. Others have argued that sales prices should be made public, allowing sellers to find out what figures are realistic, and helping buyers to set a budget.

WHAT IS A TRASPASO?

In the Spanish property sector, some words often go untranslated. Here are a few you need to be aware of.

Traspaso: In Spanish, traspaso literally means transfer, and the English legal equivalent of this term would be "lease." That means that the buyer is purchasing a right of use for a given period of time. Many traspasos have now been replaced by cesión, and you're advised to get legal advice to know exactly what your rights are.

Finca: It's a bit like a farm, a bit like a ranch, but it's really something all of its own, which is why the term finca is still used for large rural properties. A finca is, effectively, a large or small estate - a piece of land with a house or houses on it, and often close to a farm area such as a vinevard.





Aljibe: This Arabic-derived term refers to a stone covered water tank. These were vital to every Lanzarote home in the days before fresh water was regularly available, and many properties still use water that supplied to an *aljibe* by the mains. Aljibes can be converted into all sorts of other things.

Comunidad de propietarios

A rare concept in the UK, the community of owners is a legal necessity anywhere in Spain where facilities are shared by homeowners. It will have an elected president and treasurer, and hold annual general meetings devoted to the upkeep of shared assets such as entrances, communal swimming pools etc.


SHOCKING SCENES

When designing your exterior space on Lanzarote, don't forget to make the island's stark beauty and natural dynamics work alongside you. It's not difficult to approach a state of beauty and simplicity that's reminiscent of Japanese zen.

The emblems of Japanese art are Hokusai's great wave and his views of Mount Fuji, and waves and volcanoes are nothing new to the Canary Islands. In fact, the 19th century Canarian artist Nestor created paintings that are strangely reminiscent of Japanese art.

There are other parallels, too. The Spanish colonial style seen here is functional and unadorned, with plain wooden shutters, iron balconies and white walls. Lines are straight, but not too straight, and natural elements such as trees and plants occupy their own position in courtyards and gardens - hardly ever symmetrical.

The whole thing carries the feeling of wabi-sabi, the Japanese philosophy that celebrates asymmetry, roughness, simplicity, economy, austerity, modesty, intimacy, and an appreciation of the economy and efficiency of nature.

This is the ideal that Lanzarote always returns to. Even César Manrique, who embraced the most modern forms of art, never abandoned the charm of the traditional courtyard – a place where sunlight, rough lime-washed walls, black picón, raw volcanic stone and green cacti or leaves combine joyously.

Manrique understood that the simplest things are often the most profound, and that endless search for the essence of nature is a quest that still inspires us today, no matter what side of the world we live on.

For an island with a sunny, warm climate, Lanzarote can get quite damp, especially in the winter months. Here are some of the main factors to bear in mind when keeping your home dry and cosy.

to dry it out. That's why ventilation is vitally important, both inside and out. If possible, try and keep some space between items of furniture and walls to allow air to circulate. Moving furniture around can also be highly effective in protecting against damp.

LOCATION

Lanzarote's coastal areas are hugely popular among homeowners, but that sea you yearn to live near is also pretty wet. So wet, in fact, that it can seep into the ground below sea level, bringing dampness and salt damage.

But you're unlikely to escape from the damp by hitting the heights, either. On Lanzarote, homes located in elevated areas are often prone to heavy dewfalls in the morning. These places are also where clouds are likely to gather, and clouds mean rainfall. Lower temperatures at higher levels means drying out isn't as quick, either.

ORIENTATION

As we're north of the equator, there are northfacing parts of your property that are likely to receive little, if any, direct sunlight. These should be monitored closely, and if possible, airflow should be maintained.

VENTILATION

Damp thrives when there's no air movement

LIVING BEHIND



Think of glass and architecture and your mind will usually turn to big cities and shimmering skyscrapers. But the modern taste for glass has also transformed life on Lanzarote.

César Manrique's brother Carlos recently told this magazine about the house that his father built in Famara as a surprise gift for his mother. This property, with its views of the cliffs and beaches inspired the teenage Manrique, but no element was more

important to him than the large picture window that his father had installed

Windows at that time were usually small, owing to the weakness of wooden frames and the cost of replacing them, but as the 20th century progressed, larger windows became more commonplace.

Nowadays they can be found everywhere on this island, from Manrique's own creations at Mirador del Rio to the rooftop restaurant at the Gran Hotel in Arrecife. These days you're more likely to find a large patio window in a newly-built house than old-fashioned doors and windows.

This revolution has been made possible by new materials - tempered safety glass and strong but flexible steel frames, as well as new techniques and new artistic visions that have been set free by technology.

But living with glass has also been made possible by air-conditioning, heating, double glazing and other developments that have allowed us to control the temperature within our homes. Glass has many advantages, but heat retention isn't one of them, so we've had to adapt and be ingenious.

Another vital step forward has been safety glass, which means that glass doors and windows can become a perfectly normal part of households with children, or simply where there may be some rough stuff going on. Glass still demands respect, but it's no longer going to be a serious risk in any house.

But if you're thinking off glass in your home, be absolutely sure to get in touch with a respected professional with plenty of experience. This is not something you want to cut corners on.







Spain's Traffic Department is developing an App that means drivers will not have to carry their physical driving licence with them at all times.

Currently, drivers who don't have their licence with them face fines of \in 100. However, the new MiDGT App will be downloadable to any smartphone and will be accepted as proof by security forces. The App will also allow drivers to monitor their penalty points and permit them to pay fines rapidly and efficiently.

Driving licences aren't the only documents that will be accepted on the App, either. Drivers will also be able to scan and upload their vehicle registration documents to the app. Currently, all drivers must carry original copies of these documents in their car at all times.

Safety tech

The IFEMA road safety fair in Madrid premiered some of the technology that may influence and control our future driving practices.

Among the technology on display was the Alcolock – a device that measures alcohol levels in a driver's breath and only unlocks the steering wheel if they are below the legal limit. A radar device that can detect speeding vehicles at a distance of up to a kilometre away was also displayed.

Drone technology has also led to the Milvus, a three-metre fixed wing drone that can travel at up to 100 kmh in high winds and reach heights of 4,000 metres. It is planned that Milvus will be used to detect infractors and monitor roads in the case of adverse conditions.

Rain sense

This time of the year it's a good idea to brush up on your wet weather driving techniques. Here are a few you may have forgotten...

1. Check your windscreen wipers are working well. Replace if necessary.


2. Keep a cloth and some water in your car to clean windows that get dirty and splotchy after rainfall.

3. Lower your speed in the rain and leave more distance between the car in front. Lanzarote roads can become slippery in wet weather.

4. Keep your headlights on when driving in rain. In seriously heavy rain consider using rear foglights.

5. Watch other traffic closely.

6. If rain is too heavy to see properly, pull over into a safe place and WAIT.

Christmas planning

To make the most of Christmas on Lanzarote, it helps to get an idea of the important dates and customs that take place around the island. This year, to put it simply, don't expect to find normal service at any time between 20th December and 7th January.

Friday, December 6th: Day of the Spanish Constitution. This public holiday will form a "puente" (long weekend) that is often considered the start of the Christmas period.

Sunday, December 22nd: The draw for the world's biggest lottery, El Gordo, marks the start of the Christmas holidays for many.

Tuesday, December 24th: Christmas Eve. Shops remain open, although many may close early. Spanish families celebrate with an evening meal, perhaps followed by Midnight Mass at their local church.

Wednesday, December 25th: Christmas Day. Public holiday.

Thursday, December 26th: St Stephen's Day is a normal working day in the Canaries, but as the 26th and 27th fall between Christmas Day and the weekend, don't expect normal working days to be observed.

Saturday, December 28th: Day of the Holy Innocents: Spain's equivalent of April Fools' Day.

Wednesday, January 1st: New Year's Day. Public holiday throughout Spain.

Sunday, January 5th: Three Kings parades take place all over Lanzarote.

Monday, January 6th: Epiphany. Public Holiday throughout Spain.
