

SPAIN SEEKS TO CHANGE 90-DAY RULE



Spain's Tourist Secretary, Fernando Valdés, said last month that his country wishes to get rid of the 90-day limit for UK visitors to Spain, and would be lobbying for change in Brussels.

It is the first time that a senior member of Spain's government has acknowledged the problem of the 90-day-limit, which restricts non-resident British nationals to staying 90 days out of every 180 in Schengen countries.

The rule has seriously affected the plans of "swallows", British tourists who spend the winter months in Spain and the Canaries, as well as non-resident British owners of properties in Spain.

Valdés told iNews that "It is in our interest to lobby and convince the EU that we can try to make an exception. But the solution has to come from them."

However, the kind of exception Valdés has in mind is not clear. While it is unlikely that all 26 Schengen zone countries and the EU commission will agree to change the terms of the 90-in-180 day Schengen visa waiver period, there is a possibility that Valdés may be sounding out Brussels on how it would react to a decision by Spain.


The encouraging news is that his statements are the strongest indication yet that Spain is aware of how the 90-day issue affects British tourists, and that it is seeking to address it.

Andrew Hesselden, Campaign Director for the 180 Days in Spain campaign told us "It is truly wonderful to hear Sr Valdés acknowledging the difficulties that Brexit has caused for British people living fully or partly in Spain since before Brexit, as well as visitors to Spain who are frequent travellers with friends, family, work or clients elsewhere in the Schengen zone. But we don't think it's up to the EU Commission to decide."

Hesselden suggests that a simpler way might be for Spain to sign a new bilateral agreement with the UK, or even to grant a visa-waiver unilaterally that is specific to Spain: "After all, the UK already does this for Spanish people, who can currently visit the UK for up to 6 months per visit with no passport stamping and no checks on exit" he said.

Spain already has bilateral agreements with 19 other countries including New Zealand, Canada, Japan, and the USA, which typically allow either extended stays or consecutive visits immediately after visits to other Schengen countries.


In September, Spanish diplomatic sources indicated they were keen to pursue a bilateral agreement with the UK, and that they wanted "the situation to be as similar as possible to what it was before Brexit."

LOCAL NEWS

OPEN MALL OPENS

Open Mall Lanzarote, Arrecife's brand new shopping centre, opened last month to big crowds and high excitement.

The €85 million private initiative is expected to bring 500 jobs to the capital, and 1,000 more in indirect employment.

Shops that have not previously been seen on Lanzarote include the German shoe shop Deichmann, Danish furniture store JYSK and the French fashion chain Kiabi. Primark is also expected to arrive in the first quarter of 2023.

Arrecife also welcomes back Zara, whose branch in the town centre closed a couple of years ago, and residents of the capital will also be able to enjoy pizza and pasta at the legendary La Rustica.



RECYCLING IN COSTA TEGUISE

The Punto Limpio (recycling point) at Costa Teguise has finally opened to the public three years after the initially announced date.

The delay was explained by the fact that, although the facility itself was concluded in time, access roads needed to be built.

The recycling point allows residents of Costa Teguise

and other towns in the vicinity to get rid of waste that cannot be thrown out in rubbish containers, such as building rubble, garden clippings, old appliances and potentially toxic materials. It is free to use and booking is not required.

The Punto Limpio is located opposite Calle de las Buganvillas in Costa Teguise, between the Aguapark and the golf course.

ADIÓS, DOÑA JUANA

Juana Manrique, the last surviving sibling of César Manrique, died last month at the age of 95.

Doña Juana was well known for her elegant dress sense, and loved the island's carnival traditions. In 2013 she was honoured for the "many original costumes" she had created at a carnival event.

She was the only surviving member of the four Manrique children. César died in 1992, and his twin sister Ámparo and younger brother Carlos both died in recent years.

Lanzarote's Cabildo has issued condolences and paid homage to "a personality who will never be repeated, with a joyous nature and brimming with energy."

DANGEROUS CURVES

A man died last month when his car overturned while driving on the hairpin bends on the Valle de Malpaso near Haría.

Emergency services were alerted and attended the scene of the accident on the LZ-10, where an overturned car with a male driver was discovered. Paramedics confirmed the death of the driver and secured the area.



TOURIST FIGURES UP

Lanzarote Airport received 11% more visitors October than in the same month in 2019, before the pandemic started. 680.525 visitors arrived on the island last month, according to airport authority Spain's AENA.



The figures place Lanzarote at the top of the Canaries in terms of recovery, and hint at a promising winter season ahead.

The British market remains the strongest, accounting for almost half of all visitors. Domestic Spanish tourists are the second most important market, with 275,000 arrivals in the first three quarters of this year, and third place is taken by the Irish who have leap-frogged the Germans with 193,000 visitors.


French and Scandinavian figures are almost as high as they were in 2019, the last year before the pandemic, while Italian and Dutch tourists have already beaten the numbers from that year.

AIRPORT IMPROVEMENTS

€198,400 will be used to carry out various improvements at Lanzarote's César Manrique Airport.

The main change will be the re-opening of the bus parking area that lies between Terminals 1 and 2, a space which has been used to park hire cars for the last few years.

Also on the agenda are a renovation of the smokers' area at Terminal 1, and a separate project, worth €158,000, will update the premises where the falcons and hawks of the airport's Fauna Control Department are kept.



of these places are fragile, and could easily be ruined by the arrival of too many tourists. Some are also located near private farms or houses that do not welcome a continual trail of sightseers (there have been suspicions that the palm at Masdache was chopped down for this reason).

The system has worked for several years, but an increasing amount of more adventurous, independent tourists has led to increased pressure on these places - as well as on emergency services who are increasingly being called out to rescue injured or lost walkers.

The rise of social media, and especially Instagram, has also increased pressure on these places, with many visitors seeking out the perfect photo. This has led to campaigns against the practice of balancing towers of stones on beaches, or arranging them to spell out names.

However, without closing down areas of the island to everybody or funding more environmental protection officers, the only effective tactic seems to be educating visitors to treat Lanzarote's natural areas with respect.

But this only works with those who are willing to listen. Whoever chopped down the leaning palm at Masdache also took time to tear down the sign politely asking visitors not to climb on its trunk.

On the last day of October, the palmera inclinada (leaning palm tree) at Masdache was discovered lying on the gravel, its trunk sawn through until it had fallen. The damage is irreparable, and police immediately launched an investigation.

Much of Lanzarote is open to the public, but the authorities tend not to publicise many of its hidden attractions, and there's a good reason for this. Places like the gorgeous pools of Los Charcones, the Famara clifftops or the Cueva del Naturalista could easily be dangerous for those who are not well-prepared. Rather than close them off (as was done at a cave in Haría), authorities prefer to let those who are "in the know" continue to enjoy them, while effectively keeping them secret from casual visitors.

There's also the issue of protection. Many



"A FANTASTIC STORY"



Islands of Fortune: Lancarote is a swashbuckling historical novel that takes the reader back more than 600 years to the conquest of the Canary Islands.

The longer you spend on Lanzarote, the more you come to feel the ancient history of the island. For Ed Kempner, who has lived on the island for almost 30 years, this feeling came to a head in 2019, when he decided to write a novel about the invasion of the Canaries in 1402.

"I tried to imagine what it was like back then. There were only 300 people on the island, and they were continuously raided by slaves and pirates. One day I climbed Mount Tinasoria, one of the places where ancient lookouts would have been kept, and the story started coming to me."

The novel begins with the King Of Spain arranging the conquest of the Canaries with French merchant Jean de Bethencourt. Both have an interest in the venture: for the King it is establishing new dominions; for the sailor it is an opportunity to corner lucrative markets in dye.

In the next chapter we shift to Lanzarote – then known by the Maho natives as Titerrogekat. Here on the island lives Norstar, a trader from England who has stayed on the island to live with the Mahos. His life, and those of his friends and loved ones, will entwine inseparably with those of the invading conquistadores over the following chapters.

Ed spent days in local libraries researching the novel, and shows me one of the main sources, *Le Canarien*. It's a famous first-hand account of the conquest of the islands by two monks who travelled on that first voyage, and the only surviving account of how the natives lived at the time. Ed says "It's like Chinese whispers. The Mahos didn't have a voice, and we can only read about them through the words of their conquerors."

Ed also travelled to Las Palmas in Gran Canaria to visit the Canarian Museum there, and headed up site of the Maho settlement at Zonzamas, where he spoke to archaeologists who are unearthing the island's distant past. "The more I discovered, the more I realized this was an absolutely fantastic story," he says.

Ed admits openly that his is a fictionalised version of events, blending invented characters with real-life figures. "You have to fatten out characters, and writing fiction allowed me to explore issues such as my own feelings at being a foreigner who has spent many years on Lanzarote, among its people."

If the reception to the book is positive, Ed has two more volumes planned. "Once I started writing, it just started flowing," he says.

At the time of writing you can find Islands of Fortune: Lancarote at the Bookswop in Playa Blanca, Finca La Florida in La Geria, the Bike Stop Café in La Santa and the Lounge Cocktail Bar in Playa Blanca.



on the 26th, Boxing Day is also a holiday this year as Christmas falls on a Sunday.



LAST MONTH, WE GUIDED TOUR OF STRATVS, THE STUNNING WINERY THAT HAS RAISED THE BAR FOR OUALITY ON LANZAROTE. TEXT:


Our guide, Yurena, whose enthusiasm and humour are infectious, leads us up to the vineyard where the vines are currently "taking a siesta" after the summer harvest, and before the hard prune in February that begins the new cycle of grape production. Surrounded by vines, some of which are over 100 years old, with one of the most dramatic views on the island in front of us, we realise how unique this place is.

Yurena shows us how Lanzarote's malvasia vines have learnt to "crouch down" against the wind, while newer arrivals still tend to grow upwards; then shows us how the volcanic picón preserves moisture from rain and dew. Immediately, we can smell the earthy, mineral volcanic aroma of Lanzarote's soil.

Then it's a visit to what must be one of the most impressive workplaces on the island - an immense cellar where grapes are received, crushed, fermented, stored and bottled. Designed by Rafael del Castillo and architect Javier Matallana, it's cool, beautifully lit by large circular lamps, and lined with gleaming, state of the art equipment and dozens of wooden barrels.

This is where around 15 staff (who Yurena smilingly calls "the Minions") carry out and monitor every stage of the process. We wander along broad gangways where the grapes are initially received, then descend a spiral staircase to examine huge wooden vats and a room full of 225-litre oak barrels from France, each one labelled with the date and type of grape.

Finally, we head back down to the restaurant area and relax in the shade of one of the huge eucalyptus trees on the patio. We're served a glass of Finca de las Palmeras - a white malvasia wine that has been aged over lees in oak barrels, adding complexity and depth to a wine that's usually drunk when young.



Yurena describes how the first aroma of wine derives from the grape variety; the second from the fermentation process and the third from the storage method. Every bottle contains these notes, and a light, floral rosé highlights the contrasts that can be smelt and tasted.

We finish with an award-winning Moscatel dessert wine, sweet but not at all cloying, and although it's only early November, this undeniably Christmassy wine leaves us feeling merry and festive.

As well as guided visits, Bodegas Stratvs is home to the El Aljibe del Obispo restaurant, which serves amazing dishes created from produce from the nearby Finca de Uga; and there's an excellent shop as well. Over Christmas, the bodega's nativity scene is also another charming attraction.

> One of the big differences between Lanzarote's sunkissed Christmas season and colder holidays further north is food. Canarians don't have to dig into their winter stores because there is still plenty of fresh food being produced.

> The summer runs of tuna and sardines are over now, but the seafood counters will be piled higher than ever with prawns, mussels, oysters, clams and fresh fish. In Spain, seafood is perhaps more highly valued than anywhere else in Europe and local fish such as cherne and mero are Canarian Christmas favourites. And don't forget the delicious locally smoked salmon that's a Lanzarote must.

> Among the vegetables you'll find a wide range of greens, which are at the crispest and leafiest at this time of year. Canarian winter specialities include



the golden-fleshed boniato sweet potatoes, and there's never any shortage of chestnuts to roast.

The vivid colours and tangy peel of citrus fruits are essential to Christmas, and oranges, mandarins, lemons and other varieties will all be piled high in midwinter, better than at any other time of year. They'll be accompanied by winter fruits like pomegranates, chirimoyas and caquis and, of course, the grapes that are central to Spanish New Year celebrations.

And all over the island, in the kitchens of homes, restaurants, bars and societies, these ingredients will be being put to good use, as Lanzarote gears up for a Christmas season that will bring tens of thousands of guests to the table.

They'll find a warm welcome everywhere on the island. Many will seek out traditional home comforts at Christmas, and many more will eagerly seek out the exciting new dishes the island has to offer.

RECENTLY IN THE GAZETTE OFFICE, WE HAD AN ARGUMENT ABOUT WHETHER CHRISTMAS CURRY WAS A REAL FESTIVE TRADITION OR NOT. BUT EVEN IF IT ISN'T, EVERYONE AGREED THAT IT OUGHT TO BE....

For those who do have a tradition of Christmas curries, it's generally understood to be a home-made dish in which you use up some of the leftovers from the Christmas turkey on or after Boxing Day. The Christmas dinner itself is often a bit stodgy and bland – spuds, turkey, sprouts, gravy and bread sauce aren't the most intense of flavours, so a meal with a bit of zing and spice is a welcome change.

This is the Christmas curry that UK cooks like Jamie Oliver and Delia Smith have written about, and it's a particularly British dish with no close equivalent in India. It's incredibly versatile and can be an easy onepot dish or a full spread with raitas, pickles, chutneys and poppadoms, and many who have the tradition enjoy it more than the Christmas dinner itself.



But on Lanzarote, most tourists (and many British residents) will not have a huge turkey to get rid of. If they want to enjoy a curry at Christmas, they'll need to go out and order one.

It probably won't be turkey, but that's OK – a Christmas curry just has to be spicy, delicious and a bit of an event, and the Indian restaurant owners on Lanzarote know exactly how to do that. Those delicious accompaniments will all be available and nobody in your party will have to worry about cooking or cleaning up.

And while many places are fully booked on Christmas Day, you'll have several days after Christmas during which it shouldn't be too hard to make a reservation or maybe even just walk in.

So even if a Christmas curry isn't one of your festive traditions, isn't it time you made it one? You won't regret it for a moment.



SMOKED SALMON AND GUACAMOLE CANAPÉS

Lanzarote smoked salmon is a favourite treat for many islanders, and this luxurious starter make the most of it. We've used a less intense guacamole base that will complement that smoky flavour.

INGREDIENTS:

- · Crackers or pastry bases
- Finely sliced smoked salmon
- 2 ripe avocados
- 1 small clove garlic
- Handful coriander (cilantro)
- Fresh lime juice

METHOD:

Place avocado, finely chopped garlic and coriander to a bowl and mash with a fork.

Add a blob of the guacamole to each cracker and top with a slice of smoked salmon (you can use a toothpick to support it if you like).

Tip: Taste guacamole as you go, and add chilli, onion or tomato if you like.

LANZAROTE ROASTIES

You haven't tasted roast potatoes until you've tried the knobbly little papas bonitas that are available on Lanzarote. They're expensive, but the flavour is worth every penny.

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 kilo papas bonitas
- Extra virgin olive oil
- Rosemary
- Garlic
- Sea salt (flor de sal is best)

METHOD:

Preheat the oven to 220 C.

Remove rosemary leaves and bash with the back of a knife.

Parboil the potatoes for 10 minutes.

Dry potatoes and place on a baking tray with rosemary leaves. Drizzle with oil. Roast potatoes for 25 minutes until golden.

Sprinkle with salt and serve.

Tip: Add some chopped garlic towards the end of roasting.

CHOCOLATE TRUFFLES

Chocolate truffles are simply balls of ganache.

INGREDIENTS:

- 200g dark chocolate
- 120 ml heavy cream (nata para montar)
- Tbspn of softened butter
- Salt to taste

METHOD:

Break the chocolate into small pieces and place in a bowl. Heat cream in a saucepan until hot but not boiling. Pour cream over the chocolate pieces, add butter and salt. Leave for 3-5 minutes, then whisk until smooch.

Transfer to fridge and chill for at least two hours. Then mould into balls and add coatings.

Roll completed truffles in desiccated coconut, hundreds and thousands, crushed nuts, melted dark, milk or white chocolate, cocoa powder, matcha powder.

Tip: For milder truffles, use 200g milk chocolate and 80g cream.

CHRISTMAS CHAT



Spain is a country full of unique traditions and Christmas is no exception!

No holiday is complete without some iconic sweets. In Spain, the Christmas sweet is Turrón – a kind of nougat that can be either hard or soft and comes in many different flavours. There is always a plentiful supply in supermarkets, usually displayed on a festive table with lots of sweet goodies. Give it a try!

In Spanish families the fun starts on Christmas Eve, la Nochebuena when all the family come together for an indulgent dinner, often including several types of tapas, soup, seafood and roasted and cured meats.

Santa Claus, or Father Christmas is called Pápa Noél in Spain, but he's a fairly recent arrival to local festivities. Traditionally, Spanish children get their presents from the Three Kings (Los Reyes Magos) and they have to wait until 6th January to open their gifts.

On January 5th, Lanzarote locals flock to the streets to greet the Kings, who ride by on camels, throwing sweets to the masses. This is known as La Cabalgata de los Reyes.

Nowadays, children in Spain usually open a few presents on Christmas Day as well.

Finally, there's the tradition of La Nochevieja – (The Old Night) or New Year's Eve. Like Christmas Eve, it's a night of food, drink and families being together. Then, as the clock strikes midnight, people eat doce uvas (twelve grapes), one at each chime of the clock, which they believe will bring them good luck, prosperity and happiness in the New Year.




STAR

BY MID-DECEMBER, LANZAROTE'S BELENES (NATIVITY SCENES) WILL BE ON DISPLAY IN TOWNS ALL OVER THE ISLAND. HERE'S HOW TO ENJOY THIS LOVELY TRADITION.

The belenes are large, often very large, and are usually displayed in the centre of each town. Every belén will feature the basic elements of Mary, Joseph, three shepherds and three wise men making their way towards the manger (baby Jesus is often absent until Christmas Day). But there's much, much more....

That's because Lanzarote's belenes always celebrate the island they are created on, with volcanic landscapes, depictions of traditional agriculture and, often, scale models of real buildings on the island. It's an acknowledgement that Christmas has come to the island, and that the Holy family are not just in Bethlehem, but here right among us.

Some belenes also feature a caganer. This Catalan tradition is a figure of young man squatting down to do a poo which is hidden somewhere in the nativity



scene. It's especially loved by children, but you won't find it everywhere, as some regard it as vulgar.

Last year, we travelled all over the island to look at the belenes in various towns, and discovered that some are definitely worth waiting until sunset to visit. Here are our suggestions for two Christmas driving tours that will guarantee the best experience.

DAYTIME TOUR

▶ PUNTA MUJERES

One of the strangest festive displays on the island, Punta Mujeres' Belén features large dolls located in a field by the roadside. It's utterly charming and unique.

► HARÍA

Haría's lovely nativity scene reflects the cliffs, palms and rural existence of the north.

▶ TEGUISE

Teguise's Belén is a little staid compared to others, but modellers will appreciate the immense detail of the scaled-down buildings and the old town itself is even more magical at Christmastime.

▶ ARRECIFE

Last year, Arrecife's nativity scene raised the bar for all displays on the island - a huge, astonishingly detailed diorama of the whole island in a marquee on the seafront. It was accompanied by a Christmas market and the whole experience is sure to put you in a festive mood.

AFTER-DARK TOUR

► TÍAS

Tías lights up at Christmas, and the large belén in front of Tías's San Antonio church is always worth seeing, full of detail and loving care.

► SAN BARTOLOMÉ

San Bartolomé explodes into light at Christmas, with an immense Christmas tree and rows of palm trees dressed in fairy lights. In the heart of the Parque Félix Rodríguez de la Fuente you'll find its lovely belén.


► TINAJO

Tinajo's Christmas show is unmissable, and we'd advise approaching from Tiagua to get the full effect of its incredible light show. Once you're there, park and explore the "living belen", featuring real animals and life size models.

► YAIZA

Yaiza's display is the island's most famous - a stunning scale model of the island of Lanzarote. It's the imagination and creativity that makes it stand out, a genuinely moving and wondrous vision of this fiery little island.







AT THIS TIME OF YEAR, WE DECORATE OUR HOMES TO CELEBRATE THE GOOD THINGS IN LIFE. AND WHILE CHRISTMAS DECORATIONS REFLECT ALL OF OUR SENSES, THERE'S A SPECIAL FOCUS ON FOOD.

From chocolates hanging on the Christmas tree to bowls of nuts, Christmas has always been a time when food is particularly celebrated. In Spain it is, if anything, even more pronounced, with many homes displaying an entire leg of ham and several selections of polverones and turrones – the seasonal sweetmeats.

It makes sense to think about your presentation first. Choose bowls that reflect the overall decor of your home. They don't have to be shiny or tinselly – there's always a place for wood or simple earthenware at Christmas, too.

Choose your snacks and nibbles carefully and keep those bowls topped up if you have guests around. Christmas is a time of plenty, after all. But whatever you choose, there'll always be a place for nuts, whether they're brazils, pecans, hazelnuts or walnuts. Even if you don't like them much, their warm natural colours and shapes are inherently pleasing.

You can have a lot of fun with fruit bowls at Christmas – mandarins and other citrus fruits are in season, and their brightly coloured peel has always been a symbol of Christmas. Here on Lanzarote, there's a much better chance that you'll get hold of their lovely, glossy leaves, too. But there are many more lovely fruits to choose from, including yellow star fruit and bananas, red pomegranates, orange caquis and exotic pineapples, mangos and papayas.

It's also a time to play with fragrances, Cinnamon and mace can be incorporated into home made decorations, and clove-studded orange pomander balls can be prepared fresh, or dried earlier in December.

GET FURNISHED

Human beings aren't like cats that curl up in any corner. They insist on sitting down on chairs, sleeping in beds, using bathrooms and generally taking up space, and this is something you'll have to be prepared for.

You may need to buy new furniture, such as chairs and folding beds that you wouldn't otherwise use, so make sure it's collapsible, stackable or storable, and remember that there's much less difference between garden furniture and indoor items here.

Traditional Christmas meals demand a large table, but if you haven't got one, it's probably an investment you'll be unwilling to make. Instead, think about a buffet arrangement, using the furniture you've already got. It'll take a little planning, but it'll add an informal holiday vibe to your festive season.

DECORATE SMART

Forget massive trees and huge piles of gifts that take up space, and focus on keeping your Christmas decorations manageable. To do this, think vertical - hanging tinsel and other festive items where they won't get in the way. And pay special attention to lighting - fairy lights are fine, but well-placed spots or uplighters that highlight decorations can really add a touch of Christmas class.

GET THEM OUTSIDE!

A full house is hard work for hosts at any time, but Christmas preparations can mean you really feeling the pressure. That's why getting your guests out of the house is a must. On Lanzarote the weather is likely to be fine, and there's an island full of sights to see and things to do. Organise a few excursions in advance and if you have a patio or a pool, make sure it's put to full use.

Nevertheless, Spain was one of the leading artistic countries in the world, as the works of Dali, Miró and, above all, Picasso, became globally revered.



The legacy of the "Generation of 1927", an immense explosion of artistic, poetic and literary talent that arose in the late 20s, was also strong. Among those pioneering artists, a group of women who named themselves Las Sinsombreros (the refusal to wear hats was part of their rebellion against traditional values) marked one of Spain's first flourishings of female creativity, producing painters such as Margarita Manso and the surrealist Maruja Mallo.

These creative currents reached the Canaries and had a profound influence on local artists like César Manrique, but they were





also seized upon by women - usually from middle-class artistic backgrounds - the only environment at that time where a female artist was likely to receive support and encouragement.

As well as Tenerife-based artists such as Maribel Nazco and María Belén Morales, three Gran Canarian pioneers stood out.

JANE MILLARES SALL

Born into one of the most illustrious Canarian artistic families, with Irish descent on her mother's side, Jane Millares Sall's brothers included the musician Totoyo and the artist Manolo.

Jane herself began painting from an early age and was hugely productive, moving from a figurative style to more abstract works, and finally specialising in a strongly Canarian style that has been classified under the latin American "indigenist" movement.

Always socially committed, Jane was one of the strongest campaigners for a university in Las Palmas - a dream that came true in 1987.

PINO OJEDA

Also in Gran Canaria, Pino Ojeda began to write in 1938 after the death of her husband in the Spanish Civil War and by the 1950s she had become a nationally acclaimed poet. It was in this decade that the first exhibition of her paintings and sculptures was held, in Barcelona.

She was soon exhibiting throughout Europe, and became the first woman to open an art gallery in the Canarias, the Galería Arte on the Playa de las Canteras in Las Palmas. Her works, alway signed "Pinojeda" were widely admired, and Spanish Nobel Prize winning author Camilo José Cela said that "it is impossible to stay neutral faced with her sweet rocks of lava and the bitter mystery of her homeland."

LOLA MASSIEU

Lola Massieu once recalled that, as a girl, when she said she wanted to be a painter, someone in her family slapped her. That did not discourage her, though, and she learnt art by the side of her uncle and great uncle, both called Nícolas.

In the 1950s she discovered abstract art and soon became one of the most influential Canarian artists in this field. She founded the Grupo Espacio, which also included Jane Millares, and became one of the most popular figures on the Canarian art scene until her death in 2007.

The rich, bright patterns of ethnic fabrics also fit into this style and, of course, there are those warm, natural terracottas and ochres that reflect the subtle shades of the island's volcanoes.

Just get outside and let yourself be inspired by Lanzarote's kaleidoscope of colours and contrasts. Then use that inspiration to create your own Canarian Christmas at home.

THE BREXIT EXCUSE



Lanzarote lawyer Erardo Ferrer describes how some banks are using Brexit as an excuse to charge unfair fees.

Since Brexit, many banks and banking entities have introduced an increase in the banking commissions to be paid by their clients for transfers between Spain and the UK. They justify this on the grounds that, after Brexit, the bank is obliged to charge the customer these commissions for international transfers.

These commissions can sometimes be very high, especially when an ex-pat has sold a property in Spain and they wish to send the funds to the country of origin.

Nevertheless, while the UK did leave the EU, that did not affect its membership of the SEPA



(Single Euro Payments Area). This is an area in which consumers and companies can collect and pay, inside and outside national borders, under the same basic conditions and with the same rights and obligations, regardless of where they are. Brexit did not change this, and the UK continues as a member of the SEPA.

The fight with the banks is not easy, because it all starts with a formal claim that must be lodged before the customer service department of the bank in question. This claim is always rejected as a matter of course, and the next step is to lodge a claim before the Bank of Spain, with all the bureaucracy that this entails.

However, At Lanzarote Abogados, we have recovered a lot of money from our clients with these claims, which is why we encourage you to claim any money that your bank has improperly charged you for transferring money from Spain to your country of origin.

While the UK remains within the SEPA zone. Brexit should not be used as an excuse for charging unfair commissions; nor should it affect the exchange of conditions on international transfers.



BREXIT BITES



The effects of Brexit are already being felt on Lanzarote, but there is hope for a future agreement that will benefit both Britons and Lanzarote islanders, communities whose lives have been intertwined for decades.

Here at the Gazette we never told people how to vote in the Brexit referendum six years ago - you're not stupid and that's not our job. We did, however, point out that there were likely to be no benefits for the British community on the island, for British tourists or for the island itself. And so it has proved.

The transition period ended on Jan 1st 2021, at the height of the pandemic, a year after the deal signed by Boris Johnson. Immediate disadvantages became clear quickly, as businesses that relied on importing goods from the UK faced a nightmare of paperwork that usually resulted in increased prices.

Meanwhile, non-resident British home owners and long-stay travellers learned that, like other "third country (non-EU) nationals", they were now only permitted to stay for 90 days out of every 180. The effect on "swallows", who used to spend the winter months here has been profound.

In May this year, British residents who had failed or been unable to exchange their UK licences for Spanish ones discovered that they were banned from driving unless they passed a Spanish driving test. At the time of writing, the situation has not been resolved.

As for the effect on Lanzarote itself; that remains to be seen. Britain remains the island's main tourist market, and millions of Britons still come here, only slightly affected by new passport rules. The only minor "Brexit benefit" mentioned by local media - increased duty free discounts - has so far failed to materialise due to the complicated Canarian VAT system.

It is also harder for Britons to work here. For the last few decades, hundreds of British residents on Lanzarote have arrived the same way - visiting the island for a holiday, finding work and then staying. However, it is now far more difficult for younger Britons to get an employment contract here.

The Spanish government has stated that it wishes to sign a bilateral agreement that will return things to a situation that is "as close as possible" to the one before Brexit. There has been no statement on this from the UK government, and any such deal is likely to be complicated and difficult.

However, we can only hope that, with cooperation, dedication and goodwill, such a deal will go ahead. It could only bring benefits for Lanzarote and all of its residents.

NORTH AND SOUTH

Most properties on Lanzarote face southwards, towards the sunshine. However, this means that the northernfacing parts of the house may be in permanent shade and, although the island is dry, damp-proofing is rarely used and damp can be a serious problem.

Ventilation is the key here - keeping your home will aired will eliminate moisture. Leave a little space between furniture and walls to let air circulate, and if damp seems to be a real problem, you may consider investing in a dehumidifier.

Really bad weather tends to arrive from the south-west, which is where many awnings and pergolas will be located. Be absolutely sure that you can secure these against strong winds and torrential rain.

HEAVY WEATHER

Lanzarote has had dry weather for at least two years, but that long drought came to an end in September when the island received a thorough soaking . You can still see the greenery that resulted on

the hills and fields.

Rainfall does happen here, and when it does, it's often surprisingly intense. It will come down hard and fast, and it will find its way into every crack and hole available.

Unfortunately, you're likely to learn that you have leaks when it's already too late. Rain can cause serious damage to your furniture and will lead to more leaks and a damp problem if left untreated, so it's best to prepare in advance by having your roof looked at by professionals.

BE PROTECTED

If maintained, protecting your home on Lanzarote is simple. It's a question of making sure that your roof, walls, doors, and windows are watertight.

Ensure that your door and window fittings are secure and that your roof has a healthy coat of protective sealant on it to protect from water and dust.

THE CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS OFFER A GREAT OPPORTUNITY TO GET OUT AND ABOUT ON THE ISLAND, AND IF YOU'RE A GARDENER THERE'S NO BETTER TIME OF YEAR TO FIND OUT MORE ABOUT THE GARDENS AND WILD GREEN PLACES ON THE ISLAND. HERE ARE SOME OF THE BEST PLACES TO VISIT:

1. THE CACTUS GARDEN

César Manrique once said the Cactus Garden was his favourite of the works he created on Lanzarote, and it's not hard to see why. It's a lovely, strange little place, located in an abandoned quarry in Guatiza and overlooked by one of the old windmills that were so important to islanders in days gone by.

With several hundred cacti species on display, you'll soon be enchanted by the variety, the shapes and the sheer weirdness of these plants, which were also a key element of the area's economy.

2. JAMEOS DEL AGUA

The descent into the Jameo is one of the most magical experiences on Lanzarote, as you head down through large, glossy leaved monsteras and rubber plants into a volcanic tunnel. At the other end there are elegant palm trees overlooking a perfect pool, and beautifully kept plants all around.

3. CÉSAR MANRIQUE'S HOMES

Both of César Manrique's homes have wonderfully well-kept gardens. The César Manrique Foundation in Tahiche is, of course, an amazing place, inspired by Manrique's discovery of a fig tree growing from a volcanic hole. It's a masterpiece of design, and greenery is an essential element of its charm.













rambling Casa Museo de Manrique in Haría is also filled with impressive plants.

4. HARÍA

The little town that nestles among the ancient volcanoes of the north is probably Lanzarote's greenest place, and well worth a stroll just for the variety of wild and cultivated plants you'll find. Tumbledown old houses sit side by side with beautifully cultivated gardens where fruit trees and bougainvillea plants abound, there's a gorgeous tree-lined main square and there's plenty of agriculture going on, too.

Serious plant lovers shouldn't miss David Riebold's wildlife garden in the heart of the town -a fascinating project that celebrates and protects the natural species of the island. To visit, contact david.riebold@gmail.com



5. FAMARA CLIFFS

For wild plant life, a trip to the Famara cliffs is unmissable. This is the area of the island with the most varied plant life, and the largest concentration of native Lanzarote species. There are several footpaths in and around the clifftops, but we'd recommend a short hike from El Bosquecillo to the Ermita de Nuestra Señora de Las Nieves, where you'll see all sorts of plants including aeoniums and native daisies, large wild fennel plants with their yellow flowers, stocky purple thistles, convolvus and much, much more. It's a botanist's dream -just stick to the path.

HOTEL GARDENS

Many of the island's hotels have wonderfully designed and maintained gardens containing a wealth of fascinating plants, flowers and trees.

If you're not a guest, just ask permission to take a wander around at reception or book a meal at the hotel restaurant and wander at your pleasure.

We'd particularly recommend the Manrique-designed gardens in Costa Teguise's Meliá Salinas Hotel, and Luis Vallejo's wonderful work at the Jameos Playa Hotel in Puerto del Carmen.

POINSETTIA

You'll see them all over the island in the run-up to Christmas, and the vast majority of these plants will end up being discarded once the Christmas season is over. However, it's a tough, hardy customer and its leaves remain attractive long after they've lost their red colour.



That red colour is spurred by keeping a poinsettia in absolute darkness for at least two months, for 14 hours a day. You can try this yourself with a box, if you like. It might require care, but you'll be sure to have one of the few poinsettias on the island that has flowered twice.

AMARYLLIS

A gorgeous, lush deep red trumpet-shaped bloom is the main attraction here. The amaryllis flower is simply spectacular, and a real sign of Christmas opulence.

It's also a lot tougher and longer-lasting that you think. Those blooms will last for at least seven weeks, and even cut flowers are likely to stay fresh over the whole Christmas holiday.

AZALEAS

Available in several colours, including gorgeous seasonal reds and whites, the azalea guarantees blooms, colour and joy at

Once they start blooming, their flowers last up to a month, making them a great centrepiece for the whole Christmas period. They're best kept in slightly cooler areas, and away from too much heat. The soil should be kept moist at all times, with watering usually required at least two to three times a week.













CHRISTMAS CACTUS

Much-loved for their chainlike stems and their attractive trumpet-shaped flowers in a gorgeous, delicate shade of red, these Schlumbergera cacti hail from Brazil and require a little more water, shade and care than normal

They're also a wonderful Christmas gift - a delightful houseplant that requires no further decoration to bring fresh festive vibes to any home.

AEONIUM

Many of these Canarian native succulents are especially beautiful at this time of year, with red or pink tinged leaves and hugely attractive rosette colours. Once again, they're the sort of plant that can easily be decorated for Christmas.

BAY TREE

A bay tree is a perfect Christmas gift, its deep green leaves echoing the laurels and holly that are found on Christmas wreaths. It's also one of the most popular ornamental shrubs, and provides fragrant leaves for use in the kitchen all year round.

DON'T DRIVE DRUNK

DRINK DRIVING ON LANZAROTE ISN'T WORTH IT. HIT THE TOWN BY ALL MEANS, BUT LEAVE YOUR CAR KEYS AT HOME.

Almost every day on Lanzarote there's a news piece about a car that has left the road or collided with another vehicle and flipped over. Thankfully, modern car design means that deaths and serious injury are rare, but they do happen. And you most definitely do not want to be the person being cut out of their front seat by firemen.

Alcohol is involved in many of these incidents, and Spain's Traffic Department has spent years campaigning and cracking down on drink-driving. The country now takes the issue of drink-driving as seriously, or more seriously, than most others.

Yet you'll still hear friends recommending routes that are supposedly free of police patrols, still hear the excuse that "I've only had a couple". It's a self-centered attitude, but it's too late to start being responsible when a drunk driver is involved in an incident that kills or injures another person.

Spain's legal limit is 0.5 grams of alcohol per litre of blood. That means that, for most



people, two glasses of wine or .33 litre bottle of beer will put you over the limit. If you test positive at a police check, your car will be immobilised and you will face a hefty fine, starting from €500, and the loss of points on your licence. You could even face a prison sentence.

IT'S EASIER AND SAFER NOT TO DRINK AT ALL.

Elect a designated driver who will remain sober on your evening out; organise a taxi or look into the night buses available. If you find yourself too drunk to drive, leave your car where it is, take a taxi and pick it up the next day. Do not risk getting behind the wheel when

you are over the limit.

GO EASY

For all drivers, it's a good idea to bear the season of the year in mind and drive carefully and defensively. Just because you're sober doesn't mean that other drivers are.

This applies early in the mornings and, in the Christmas holidays, the afternoons, too. These are times when drivers could be making their way home from a night on the tiles or a long liquid lunch. Keep speed down, maintain space between cars and treat any vehicle behaving erratically with caution.
